



I'm a General Service Representative – NOW WHAT?

Congratulations! You have been entrusted by your meeting with a very important C.A. service commitment.

As a GSR, YOU are the trusted voice for your meeting at the Area level within the service structure of C.A. You are the lifeline between your meeting and the rest of our C.A. Fellowship. Your participation is vital to C.A. Unity (the 1st Tradition) and helping the addict who still suffers.

Your responsibility begins with attending the monthly Area Service Committee meeting, which is held the second Monday of each month. You (the GSR) carry your meeting's vote on issues that affect the SFVCA Fellowship. Make sure that you have an Alternate GSR who will attend the monthly Area meeting if you can't. Be a part of your C.A. Fellowship and make your meeting's vote count!

An effective GSR...

- Attends the monthly ASC meeting (or sends an Alternate) so that your meeting always has current information.
- Picks up the monthly **GSR Report** to use during your report at your meeting.
- Takes multiple copies of **Newsletters**, **Event Fliers**, etc. back to your meeting.
- Brings money donated by your meeting to the Area. For more information, please see the C.A. pamphlet "The 7th Tradition (where does the money go?)"
- Makes notes of information not included in the GSR Report to include in your report.
- Delivers the GSR Report with enthusiasm! If you don't care about the information you are presenting, neither will anyone else.
- Asks questions and becomes familiar with the materials in the GSR Service Manual, namely the SFVCA Service Manual, Bylaws and C.A. World Service Manual.
